



INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARTICIPANTS

DOCUMENTS

1. Each participant should arrive at the site of the Round with a set of their own **pre-completed documents**:
 - a) Appendix No. 2 Control Test Sheet
 - b) Appendix No. 4 Declaration
 - c) Appendix No. 6 Consent to Data Processing
2. **DECLARATION AND CONSENT TO DATA PROCESSING are completed by each person entering the Track Masters trial site (driver, pilot/passenger).**
3. **The Organiser will prepare blank document sheets for participants without the above-mentioned documents, to be filled in on the spot, at a cost of EUR 10/pc!!!!!!**
4. After the Control Test, and prior to the obligatory check-in, the participant goes to the Event Office with a set of documents allowing for data verification – their identity card, driving licence, registration card and third party insurance policy.

CAR

1. The participant arrives at TM Rounds in a refuelled and clean car.
2. Before and after the start, each competitor is obliged to check the technical condition of their car, in particular by:
 - a. checking the oil level in the engine;
 - b. checking the condition of wear of brake pads and the level of brake fluid;
 - c. checking if the car has any oil or coolant leaks;
 - d. checking if the car has any brake fluid and fuel leaks;
 - e. checking tire pressure.

3. The Organiser recommends checking the car multiple times after each session on the track.

HELMETS AND BELTS

1. Helmets are mandatory for Track Masters riders and pilots!
2. The helmet must be certified (Snell or FiA) and approved for use in motorsport. Motorcycle helmets are allowed.
3. All persons in the car must have their seat belts properly fastened and tightened at the hips.

PLAYER'S ESSENTIALS

1. The organiser recommends that you bring with you:
 - a. engine oil for refills;
 - b. brake fluid for refills;
 - c. spare brake pads just in case;
 - d. tyre pressure gauge;
 - e. basic tools;
 - f. water, sunglasses, sunscreen.
2. The Organiser requires you to have your own rubbish bag and not to leave your rubbish in any place other than a rubbish container.
